This week I write with the sad news, that Howard Peacock, who has been a regular member of St. Paul's for many years and was a resident of Rosedean Nursing Home, along with Dorothy, whom so many of us know so well - has died. I was very fond of Howard and will miss seeing him when David, Fiona and I lead services & visit the home - as well as at St. Paul's itself. Howard had a wonderful sense of humour - often pretending to be asleep, whilst listening to everything that was going on... and then suddenly opening his eyes wide in front of you! He had a beautiful smile & chuckle, and could light up the space around him for others. A real gift.

Howard's death is thought to have been caused by old age (he was 86) but the exact details are unknown at the present time. Please do pray for his family and the other residents of Rosedean, all of whom have additional and complex needs, and who are struggling to understand what has happened and to adjust to life without someone who they shared a home with and saw every day.

I am in regular contact with the Home - and have taken round card and gifts on all of our behalf, as appropriate.

1) An Update from Andrew Shaw

Congratulations to Andrew, who has now almost completed his training as a Licensed Lay Minister for our parish! YES! Well done!!

Andrew has a couple more assignments to complete, but has been signed off by Bishop Andrew. Although his licensing is postponed (due to the current coronavirus crisis - and we will circulate more information about the new date in due course), Andrew is being given Bishop's 'Permission to Minister' in the Diocese, without being formally licensed in the meantime. He and I are meeting soon to chat and plan this together, but it is wonderful to have Andrew 'aboard officially' in this way.

He writes of his recent placement at St. Mary's Ewell:

An integral part of my training to be a Licensed Lay Minister was to spend from January to Easter in a different parish. Sadly, my experience ended on March 15th, but I had completed enough research for my major assignment: a theological reflection on my time at St. Mary's Ewell.

St. Mary's is an Anglican Church, but with a traditional, high church flavour. Each main morning service is a Sung Eucharist led by a robed choir. I was able to join this excellent choir for a couple of services, and particularly enjoyed listening to them for the Ash Wednesday service, where the unaccompanied Tudor music lent a special solemnity to the occasion. St. Mary's puts great emphasis on encouraging families to bring their children to baptism; they also have an annual service to celebrate marriage, when they all enjoy a glass of prosecco! Another important strand in St. Mary's outreach has been a series of organ recitals. The exceptionally talented organist (before the lockdown) was drawing audiences nearly three times as big as those for Evensong – amongst those who went were Neil Thomas and two other organists who worship at Burgh Heath.

2) An update on the work of Yagya and Sally Singh in Nepal

6) The Churches Opening For Private Prayer

A number of you have heard the news that churches in the UK are now allowed to open for private prayer.

Some of you have been in touch about this - excited, or worried, or both in the last week.

It is wonderful that the churches are beginning to be able to open in a small way again (for which we praise God!). However in order to ensure that this is done safely - and with the welfare of all who may attend such an opportunity central to our thoughts - there is quite a bit of preparation, paperwork and risk assessments/ risk actions associated with even opening on a very small scale.

The incumbents (Vicars) from the deanery met yesterday via Zoom to talk about how to approach this together, to support each other and also to try and maintain consistency amongst the local C of E churches.

The general consensus is that it is best to do this wisely and slowly. Starting small and adding to the opportunities very gradually. None of us wish to do anything which could be the cause of the virus spreading again - and especially not to our own church families, whom we all love so very much.

In our parish, I also want to be in touch with the Wardens, standing committee and PCC on this, but will write again with further updates soon.

In the meantime please assume that

a) Nothing will change for at least 2 more weeks in the parish (both churches will remain fully closed - with everything continuing to happen via email, Youtube and Zoom, whilst cleaning and preparation happens inside each church) until at least the week beginning Monday 29th June - and I will write with further updates as to what may (or may not) change then, keeping a check on the Government, National Church and Diocesan advice - all of which change almost daily

b) When things do begin to be able to happen, this will be very gradual. We are likely to be mainly online for a long while yet - and even when services can start again on Sundays in some form, over half of our church family are over 70 (and more at risk/ vulnerable) - so there is likely to need to be supplementary online worship to go alongside whatever will be able to happen in the churches for a long while yet, for those who wish for it.

This coming week, I hope to send out some survey questions to ask each of you your thoughts on some of the different options which may come available to us in the coming weeks and months, to ascertain your views and feelings - to feed into our planning process.
